PHILIP SCHELL PSH MALBEC

LUJAN DE CUYO, ARGENTINA







Philip Schell, a Frenchman native from Bordeaux, arrived in Mendoza in 1998 as a business partner to the famous winemaker Michel Rolland. Today he is running with passion his own project looking for the best "terroir" for Malbec in Mendoza, and obtain the great expression of Argentina's most famous grape variety in the world. While the care of the vineyard is under the direction of Mr. Schell, the resulting wines are bottled at the Fabre Montmayou winery in Vistalba – Lujan de Cuyo, 18 km north of the city of Mendoza, Argentina.

The Fabre Montmayou winery was built in Vistalba - Lujan de Cuyo, 18 km north of city of Mendoza, Argentina, in the purest Chateau Style of Bordeaux. It is surrounded by 37 acres of Malbec vineyards that were initially bought by the owner and director, Hervé Joyaux Fabre. Since then the winery has expanded by buying over 180 acres of old-vine vineyards in the best wine growing areas of Mendoza.

Traditional farming methods without the use of herbicides are used to obtain the best grapes while respecting the environment. Short pruning and green harvesting are used to ensure the balance of each vine, and to arrive at target yields for each wine. With constant care and personal style, essential elements for great quality, Fabre Montmayou combines modern winemaking, Mendoza's terroir and the Bordeaux "savoir faire" to produce wines with a unique personality.
