The Allendorfs family's roots can be traced back to the 13th century, but wine wasn't their métier until Philipp Anton Allendorf founded the estate... in 1773! With nearly a quarter-millennium under its belt, the family has accumulated over 140 acres, and, thanks to Fritz Allendorf's leadership in the second half of the 20th century, most of these vines lie in prestigious sites like Hasensprung. Currently, the estate has been taken over by Fritz's son, Ulrich, and he works tirelessly to continue the traditional winemaking practices of his father and the countless generations before him.

The Allendorf wine estate has vineyards in Assmannshausen, Rüdesheim, Oestrich and Winkel, including the "VDP.GROSSE LAGE" classified sites: Hasensprung, Jesuitengarten, Berg Roseneck and Höllenberg. VDP.GROSSE LAGE designates the highest quality vineyard sites in Germany. The very best wines can be found here - bursting with expressive character derived from their site and special maturing potential. The sites are narrowly demarcated into parcels and planted with just the right grape variety for that particular location.
